

10 Step Guide to Planning Your Swiss Vacation

1



Choose your travel dates

Select your vacation dates based on what you want to see and do in Switzerland and when you can get time off work. Your travel dates may influence availability, prices, and activities.

2



Set your budget

Establish a realistic budget that covers flights, accommodation, transport, food, activities, and travel insurance. Make sure you include a little extra for unplanned activities - and lots of Swiss chocolate!

3



Start researching

Use our free resources - website, podcast and Facebook group - to decide where you'd like to visit and what you'd like to see and do during your Swiss vacation.

4



Check passport and visa requirements

Ensure your passport is valid for at least six months beyond your travel dates. Depending on your nationality, you may also need a visa or visa-waiver to enter Switzerland.

5



Plan your itinerary

Map out an itinerary that includes where you'll go, how long you'll stay in each place, and how you'll travel between destinations. Leave room in your daily sightseeing itinerary for spontaneity and flexibility in case of bad weather.

6



Book flights and purchase travel insurance

Once you've chosen your dates and outlined your itinerary, book your international flights to lock in the best fares. Travel insurance is a must - it protects you against unexpected cancellations, medical emergencies, lost luggage and more.

Book accommodation

Book early, especially during peak seasons, to secure the best options. Consider staying near public transport for convenience, and check cancellation policies in case your plans change.

8



Buy your rail pass or book your rental car

After choosing your mode of transport, book your rental car or buy your rail pass or train tickets. Seat reservations for the panoramic trains should be booked in advance, too.

9



Book any must-do experiences or day tours

Book ahead for your must-do experiences (that aren't weather dependant) so you don't miss out. Examples include Lindt Home of Chocolate and reservations for some restaurants.

10



Prepare for departure

Confirm all bookings, print or save key documents, and check your airline's luggage limits. Buy an eSIM or international data plan, and notify your bank of overseas travel.



21 useful things to know about Switzerland before you visit

-
- 01** The local currency is the Swiss franc. Euros may be accepted in some tourist destinations but change will always be given in Swiss francs.

 - 02** Tipping is not compulsory, nor expected. It is customary to round the bill (check) up to the nearest Swiss franc if you receive good service.

 - 03** You almost always have to pay for water served at restaurants, even if it is still or tap water.

 - 04** You'll find drinking fountains in every town or village. The water is always safe to drink (unless a sign says otherwise) so fill your water bottle for free.

 - 05** English is widely spoken in popular tourist areas but it is polite - and appreciated - to greet a shopkeeper, waiter or person on the street with a hello in the local language.

 - 06** Most Swiss are fairly reserved. Speaking loudly in public - especially whilst on the phone or on public transport - is considered rude.

 - 07** Whilst there are a huge range of cuisines available in Switzerland, some restaurants, cafes and Alpine inns only serve traditional Swiss meals.

 - 08** In order to protect their stunning environment, the Swiss take garbage disposal and recycling seriously. Please dispose of your trash in the correct manner.

 - 09** Most shops are closed on Sundays. The exceptions are shops at major train stations and airports and in some tourist towns.

 - 10** Switzerland has a high cost of living. Many visitors find the cost of goods and services to be higher than what they pay at home.

Switzerland uses both 2-pin type C and 3-pin type J plugs. Type C 2-pin plugs are also compatible with type J 3-pin sockets, and there are more of these than 2-pin type C ones.

12

Displaying times in the 24-hour clock format is standard in Switzerland. For example 2:15 in the afternoon will be written as 14:15.

13

Dates are written in the format DD/MM/YYYY so June 24, 2026 will be displayed as 24/06/2026.

14

Daylight saving time begins at 2am on the last Sunday in March and finishes at 3am on the last Sunday in October.

15

Air conditioning is not common in Switzerland (including in hotels), and historic buildings rarely have elevators/lifts.

16

Hotel rooms are typically smaller than what you would expect in the United States.

17

Swiss trains are known for their reliability and punctuality. If you have a train to catch, don't arrive at the station late. The train won't wait!

18

It is common to pay a fee to use the WC/bathroom at train stations. This is usually around CHF 1 and payment can often be made by card.

19

The SBB Mobile app is a must-have app for checking timetables for all public transport. You can also purchase tickets via the app.

20

Most supermarkets have a good range of high quality pre-packaged salads and sandwiches which make great budget-friendly meals.

If you plan on travelling around Switzerland using the excellent public transport system or will visit numerous mountains in a particular region, it's worth considering purchasing a rail pass. A rail pass acts as a hop on hop off ticket throughout the area of validity and can save you a significant amount of money.

Depending on the rail pass you choose, it may also cover travel on buses, boats, cable cars and funiculars and offer discounted or free admission to other attractions.
